Hydroponic Systems & Community Farming Kits

Through a grant from the Moore Foundation, ADRA Bahamas was able to host a distribution on October 8th in Grand Bahama. Three (3) local female farmers (Williams, Miller, and Burger) residing in the Marco City area, each received a hydroponic system with the intentions of enhancing their farming experience. These ladies farm on a day-to-day basis and supply their neighbors, friends and family with produce.

Our Community Farming Kits initiative sought to support community food self-sufficiency in providing agriculture farming kits to households throughout all 5 constituencies of Grand Bahama. Some households voiced how the provision of a gardening kit motivated them to start their own backyard garden as well as how "this initiative [sic] was very good...start up veggie garden and food and also therapeutic".



"I feel the idea of getting Bahamians to grow their own food is totally awesome."



Education

School & Educator Home Rehabilitation

Education should be something that every child can have access to, so that they can be equipped with necessary tools to have a better future. Since the passage of Hurricane Dorian in 2019, ADRA Bahamas has been supporting the rehabilitation of schools to get students back to an optimal learning environment. 2021 saw an expansion of our efforts within the education system of the crisis-affected zones through the provision of construction materials and labour to repair & build 7 schools throughout Grand Bahama and Abaco within both private and public sectors, to help students return to a safe school and classroom setting amid the Covid-19 pandemic, reaching over 400 students through these efforts. As educators are just as important to ensuring students return to the classroom, ADRA Bahamas facilitated the repair of 22 roofs for educators (inclusive of Administrators to Custodians) to return them to liveable conditions, directly impacting a total of 96 persons.

Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR)

ADRA Bahamas implemented the Disaster Risk Reduction and Resilience pilot program in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and the Bahamas Christian Council for teachers and clergy as a response to the vulnerability of communities. The goal of this project was to increase resilience of local communities through the improvement of preparedness and response mechanisms as a result of lessons learned from Hurricane Dorian.

The main achievements of this project were:

- 1. The creation and implementation of a DRRR training tool made available to all persons trained
- 2. The development of 5 training modules, community education on DRRR, and family level preparedness plan.

Over 200 participants were trained as trainers to provide training in their communities to help them develop resilience in the face of future disasters. Our pilot DRRR training program has been expanded to now include all community members in The Bahamas, is underway and will be completed in February 2022.

ADRA Bahamas DRR project sought to equip communities by providing the tools that will give them knowledge to move forward and build for themselves a better future.



Operation Smile of A Child

ADRA Bahamas seeks to bring cheer and a smile through giving gifts to children in vulnerable groups during the holiday season. We saw an increase in participation and giving with this being our 2nd year, as the **Hillview Seventh-day Adventist Church Pathfinder Club** (New Providence, The Bahamas) joined in on our quest to ensure frowns, did in fact, turn upside down in 2021!

After our volunteers gave hours towards clearing, sorting, packaging, labelling and sorting once again, a total of **140 gift packages were donated to children within the Foster Care system of Social Services.** We ensured that children from ages 2 to 16 were accommodated with gifts ranging from puzzles and basketballs to pogo sticks, electronic games, hygiene gift packages for our preteens and so much more.

We're grateful to our gifting partner for this year; to Mrs. Duvalier, Social Services representative, for her willingness to allow us to share the gifts with children she knew would appreciate it most and certainly we are excited to see what 2022 brings with gifts for the children, more partners and new additions to our hearts & hands i.e. volunteers!



Emergency Management

St. Vincent - Volcano

On April 9, 2021, and for the first time in 40 years, the La Soufrière volcano erupted on the island of St. Vincent causing massive physical damage, directly **displacing over 23,000 residents** and sending an ash plume 6.2 miles high into the sky and reaching other Caribbean islands, including Barbados and St. Lucia. The ADRA Network provided immediate aid to the affected residents of St. Vincent in the aftermath of the volcano. **ADRA Bahamas was able to send over USD\$5,000.00** to aid with the recovery efforts undertaken by the ADRA Network in St. Vincent.

ADRA Bahamas, through its donor network received financial gifts to provide relief aid to the affected communities. In partnership with the ADRA Network, **a meals program was operated at 11 shelters providing over 80,000 meals.**



"ADRA has been able to provide much needed humanitarian assistance to the people of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines thanks to the generous support of its donors and the commitment of its staff and volunteers on the ground, many of whom are from the same affected communities and left their homes behind as well," says Lisa Schnurr, ADRA's Emergency Response Coordinator in St. Vincent & the Grenadines.




